Re: Implementation of Mandatory Electronic Filing - Surrogate's Court – Nassau County

I am pleased to provide the Bar and other interested persons with an update on the progress of the New York State Courts' Electronic Filing System ("NYSCEF"). The implementation of a mandatory e-filing program in the Nassau County Surrogate's Court has been proposed by the Acting District Administrative Judge of Nassau County, after consultation with the Surrogate and with the support of the Deputy Chief Administrative Judge Outside NYC. As a result of this additional mandatory program, the 10th Judicial District will have implemented mandatory e-filing in all Supreme and Surrogate's Courts throughout the District.

Beginning December 22, 2021, the authorization will be to implement mandatory e-filing in the Nassau County Surrogate's Court to include:

- newly filed probate and administration proceedings and miscellaneous proceedings relating thereto and,
- such other types of proceedings as the court may permit.

Persons wishing to comment on this proposal should e-mail their submissions to efilingcomments@nycourts.gov no later than December 15, 2021. A new page has been created on the Unified Court System's website - www.nycourts.gov/rules/efiling/ - to provide notice to the public of proposed new or expanded mandatory e-filing programs and for posting any public comments received on such proposals. Attorneys, paralegals and interested filers may register on-line for upcoming sessions.

Please note that by legislation and statute all unrepresented parties are automatically exempt from participating in e-filing in any case. However, unrepresented parties may choose to e-file. Information on how to do so is available at <http://www.nycourts.gov/efile-unrepresented>. Attorneys who certify in good faith that they lack requisite hardware, electronic connection, or technical knowledge to participate in e-filing, may opt out of e-filing.

E-filing represents an important and necessary advance for the courts and the legal profession in New York State. We thank you for the wonderful support and cooperation you have shown and look forward to continuing to work closely with you as the program continues to move forward.
